Subject: Howe Island Township East 3-Car Ferry Breakdown & Ice Conditions

## **Background:**

On Saturday, March 22, 2025, the Howe Island Township East 3-Car Ferry experienced a significant mechanical failure involving the main drive wheel and shaft. At the time, the ferry was navigating through several acres of **drift** ice. Fortunately, there were no vehicles or passengers on board—only the operator was present.

Municipal staff accessed the ferry from the mainland using a small boat, and the operator was safely removed due to the hazardous conditions. The drifting ice exerted enormous pressure on the cable, pushing everything downriver. A tugboat was deployed to assist and successfully guided the ferry to shore on the mainland side.

## **Key Facts:**

- Drift ice is extremely powerful and can be highly destructive when
  propelled by wind and momentum. Different types of ice—such as bay ice
  and shale ice—vary in strength and impact. It is common to see damage
  to docks and shorelines following the spring ice breakup.
- Township ferry operations have been **challenged by significant ice conditions** this winter, increasing stress on the ferry, its cable, and the drive system.
- While staff are committed to maintaining ferry operations, the 3-car ferry has been pushed beyond typical operating expectations due to these extreme conditions.
- Public frustration is understandable when ferry delays occur. However, directing frustration toward frontline ferry staff is neither helpful nor productive. Unless you have experience operating the ferry, understanding its capabilities, and assessing real-time ice conditions, directing staff on operations is not beneficial.
- To prevent unnecessary high-risk situations, municipal ferry staff have been instructed to avoid drifting ice and allow it to pass before crossing. While this decision may not always seem necessary from a passenger's perspective, the Township prioritizes safety in all operational decisions.

## **Going Forward:**

The ferry staff will **continue prioritizing safety**—reducing risk, protecting the public, and preserving ferry equipment. This cautious approach will remain in effect as the **Howe Island East 3-Car Ferry** continues operations.
